Monday	<p>English</p> <p>Oral Language: Continue practising the days of the week / months of the year / seasons / weather. Ask the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What day is today? / What day was yesterday? / What day will tomorrow be?• What is the month? / What is today's date?• What season are we in?• What is the weather like? <p>Talk about the seaside with your child. Name the different things you might see there. Eg, sand, waves, sandcastles, bucket and spade, parasol shells, crab, etc. You might like to draw a beach picture.</p> <p>**Reading: Read this ebook from Oxford Owl – <i>Clothes For Rain</i> and play activities</p> <p>Set up details on Oxford Owl Account below.</p> <p>Writing/Phonics: Make a list of 5 words that start with b</p> <p>**Handwriting: The letter b: Just Handwriting p46</p> <p>Tricky Words: New words for the week – for, on, they, but, had</p> <p>Adult writes the word on card twice. Cut up each word. Play matching pairs to find the words that are the same. Make sure to say each word when card is turned over.</p> <p>Maths</p>

Oral Maths Games: adult writes each number on a piece of card from 0 to 20. Make sure your child is looking at and pointing to each of the numbers when saying them.

1. Count forwards on the numberline from 0 to 20.
2. Count backwards on the numberline from 0 to 20.
3. Jumble all the number cards up, order them from 0 to 20.
4. Make the numberline from 0 to 20. Child turns away. Take away a number. Child has to say which number is missing.
5. Number tennis. You say 0, your child says 1, you say 2, your child says 3, etc.
6. Start and stop counting from different places on the numberline. *Eg. Start at 3, stop at 9*

****SEE NOTE BELOW ON STEPS INVOLVED WITH ADDITION***

1. On a piece of paper, draw a large circle. Have a pencil that you can divide the circle in two by placing it in the centre.
2. You will need small counters that can fit in this circle. It might be pieces of lego, crayons, etc.
3. With the pencil in the middle of the circle put two counters on one side of pencil but within the circle. Put one counter on the other side of the pencil but with the circle.
4. Ask you child to say how many is on each side of the pencil. **There are two counters on this side and one counter on this side.**
5. Ask you child how many counters are there altogether. When they have them counted, tell them we will see if they are correct. Lift the pencil away and count from left to right. Then say, two **and** one **makes** three.

- Practise this **LOTS** this week. Much of the maths work this week is oral based but is as important as book work.
- When making different addition problems from the children make sure that the total will only be as high as 10.

Maths

Over the next few weeks, we would like for you to begin the process of teaching your child addition. Please keep to these steps and not go ahead of what we are doing for each week. For this week, it is primarily oral based and will involve you talking through the topic with your child.

Please use the following steps when beginning the teaching of addition:

1. On a piece of paper, draw a large circle. Have a pencil that you can divide the circle in two by placing it in the centre.
2. You will need small counters that can fit in this circle. It might be pieces of lego, crayons, etc.
3. With the pencil in the middle of the circle put two counters on one side of pencil but within the circle. Put one counter on the other side of the pencil but with the circle.

4. Ask you child to say how many is on each side of the pencil. **There are two counters on this side and one counter on this side.**
5. Ask you child how many counters are there altogether. When they have them counted, tell them we will see if they are correct. Lift the pencil away and count from left to right. Then say, two **and** one **makes** three.

High Knee



Count to 10 and repeat

Squat Jump



Squat down and then jump in the air. Repeat 10 times.

Russian Twists



Sit on the ground, lean backwards with feet off the grounds. Hold hands and move hands from one side of the body to other. Repeat 10 times.

Wall Sit

Find a wall. Lower yourself down the wall keeping your back to the wall, similar to the person above. Can you stay there for 30 seconds?

Burpees



Stand tall. Lower yourself into plank and then put chest on the floor. Jump up so that your feet meet your hands. Clap hands above your head.
